<u>Freshmen Pow Wow: Thursday, August 5</u>. All freshmen will need to attend our Pow Wow in order to receive their class schedules, and Chromebooks, and have the opportunity to pay their device fee and purchase spirit items from the Student Store. See the enclosed flyer for details.

<u>Sophomore, Junior and Senior Pow Wows: Friday, August 6</u>. Students will pick up their class schedules and families may purchase all the same items, as well as pay any outstanding fees and fines. Please refer to the enclosed flyer for more information and schedule.

<u>Dress Code expectations to keep in mind when back-to-school shopping:</u> Tulare Union students are expected to dress appropriately while at school and at all school-sponsored activities.

- Student dress and appearance shall not be hazardous to the safety of anyone in the school, be offensive in nature, or promote gang activity, alcohol, drug or tobacco products.
 - Strap width on tops must be at least 1-1/2 inches, and all shorts and skirts must be mid-thigh or longer.
- Caps and hats are not permitted on campus. From November 1 to March 1, beanies will be allowed outdoors and must be: Free of designs other than district/school logos, free of any gang affiliation, and free from advocating any alcohol, drug or tobacco product. Any beanie not deemed appropriate by a school administrator will be confiscated. Upon approval by site administration and for sun protection, students are allowed to wear a full brim hat that is constructed of cotton or canvas material, capable of being folded up while in the classroom. These hats must be: Free of any type of logo or writing; Solid white or khaki color, and removed upon entering the school building.
 - Pants must fit at the waist, hips, crotch and thighs.
 - Shoes must be worn at all times.
